



Medicare Electronic Data Interchange

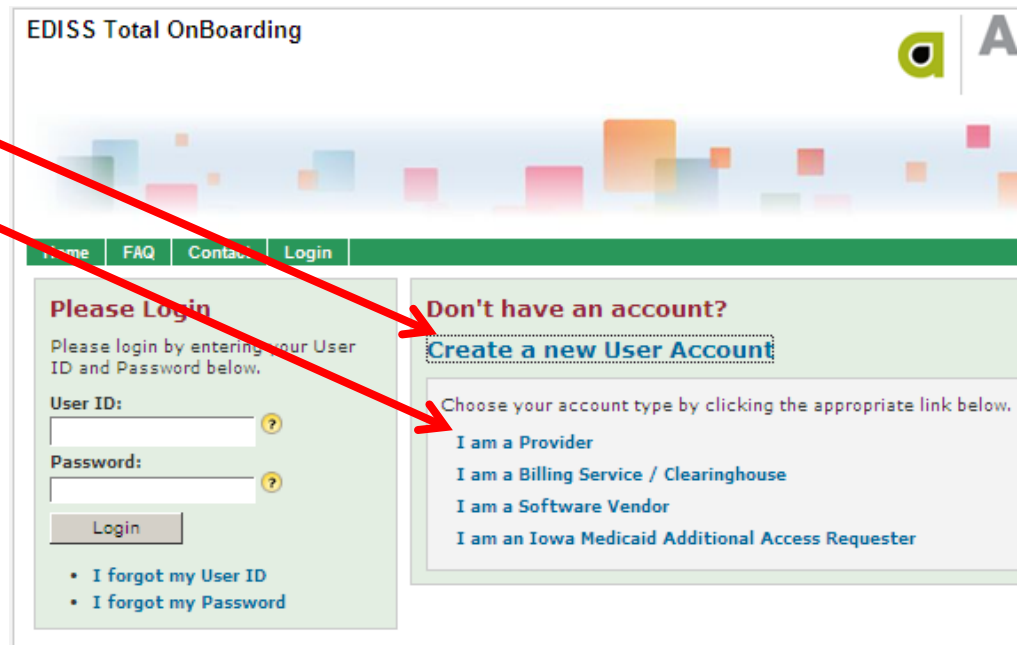
The purpose of electronic data interchange or “EDI” is for Medicare to receive claims from your electronic billing system. Testing, or onboarding, ensures that this process runs smoothly, the systems are compatible, and data are secure.

Step 1: Go to <https://connect.edissweb.com/>.

Step 2: Create new user account.

Select “I am a provider.”

Follow the next page prompts. EDISS = Electronic Data Interchange Support Services. You can check “No” then “next.”



Step 3: complete the provider registration. The site offers a detailed provider tutorial on their registration process: <http://tinyurl.com/ngyhjll>.

Step 4: Prepare to test your data exchange connectivity. Your IT support will need to be involved. See the online guide at www.edissweb.com/cgp/software/understand.html. The online guide should walk you and your IT support through a test onboarding. If the test is successful, you will be notified that you’re ready to begin Medicare EDI.

TIP: If you use a clearinghouse to file Medicare claims, you can skip onboarding and testing of your internal electronic data exchange system. That’s because the clearinghouse does the electronic claim submission for you.
